Desert Tortoise	Reptile	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • grasses • herbs • flowers • cacti 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • sandy flats • rocky foothills • canyons • places they can burrow 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 10-14" long • high-domed, greenish tan shell • weighs 8-15 pounds 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 95% of their lives spent in burrows • dormant November to March • live up to 80-100 years
Barn Owl	Raptor	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • swoops down over open ground to catch small vertebrae, like mice 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • everywhere in the world except polar and desert regions 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • pale, long-winged, long-legged, with a short tail • 10-18" long • 30-43" wing span 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • most common owl • heart-shaped face that looks like a mask • screams
Black Bear	Ursidae	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 90% vegetation • young shoots and shrubs • berries and fruit • grasses • insects 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • large forests in North America 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • broad head with narrow muzzle • short rounded claws that taper to a point • small rounded ears 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • marks trees with claws to show dominance in an area • very dexterous • runs 30 m.p.h.
